a. Administration Report: Dawn Walmsley and Stephen Woodcock School Goals/Assurance Plan - Dawn

Staggered entry August/September went well. Staff and parents enjoyed the staggered entry. Our school grew with the boundary changes, there are currently 370 students in the EEP to grade 5 classes. NS was able to add an AM Kindergarten teacher, a grade 4, part time grade 2, and is going to hire a part time grade 3 teacher and a part time grade 5 teacher to support our students in larger classes. We will be in touch if your child is affected.

Still navigating AHS rules, Covid and all that comes with it. Field trips and parent volunteers are on hold. We are in charge of making sure staff and students are safe. Recognize that everyone has different viewpoints. We comply with what is asked but please contact Steve or Dawn if you would like clarification and how we can provide the best support for our students and families.

Masks – we do need help with parents sending them and an extra one every day. The cost now comes out of our school budget. Keep our students engaged with announcements on TEAMs and include the students by having them on during the announcements too.

Terry Fox Walk - met and beat our goal of \$700 (\$814).

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In the process of planning activities and lessons for Truth and Reconciliation Week next week. Orange Shirt Day on Sept 29th. No school Sept 30th. Many activities provided city wide to promote involvement and awareness of this day. Picture Day Sept 28th.

Highlight Reel for this month - Steve

Core Values: We were a Leader in Me school 3 years ago, as a staff we determined our values and characteristics of the ways of students contribute to the community and created our values: Collaboration, Responsibility, Compassion and Resilience. Use the Imagine a...World, Place, etc. (books)

Talk about inclusion: Everybody Needs a Rock (book). Each class does individual lessons for math, science, social and language arts. Talk about the 4 values every day. Focus on values for every assembly and recognize students. Engaging with students during assemblies on TEAMs. Getting the students involved. Students may be recognized with bracelets, in the hallways, assemblies, etc.

Welcome to NS video made in June for new families on Twitter, Facebook and our website.

Starting a student leadership club: have students from each class come together in a safe way to set up special days and shape the way we do things here and promote special days in their classrooms.

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Member Roles School Council

Chair It is expected that the school council chairperson will be a parent of a student attending the school. The chair should be someone who can work collaboratively and knows how to organize both programs and people. The chair should actively encourage others to become engaged in meaningful ways. Typical chairing duties include:

- chair all meetings of the school council
- coordinate with the principal to establish meeting agendas
- ensure that the operating procedures are current and followed be the official spokesperson of the school council
- ensure there is regular communication with the whole school community
- stay informed about school board policy that impacts school council
- comply with the School Councils Regulation by providing the school board with an annual report that summarizes the school council's activities for the previous school year, including a financial statement relating to money, if any, handled by the school council

Vice-Chair On some school councils, the role of chair is shared, either through the creation of cochairing positions or through the chair's dependence on the vice-chair to undertake part of the work. Typically, the vice-chair's duties are, in the event of resignation, incapacity or leave of absence of the chair, to fulfill the chair's responsibilities, and in the absence of the chair, supervise the affairs and preside at meetings of the school council.

Secretary The school council secretary typically acts as a recorder at each meeting and ensures that the minutes are prepared accurately to reflect the directions agreed to at the meeting.

Treasurer If the school council is handling money, through fundraising activities or donations, the treasurer keeps accurate records of all financial transactions and ensure that records are available upon request of the school board or school community.

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
