- December meeting policy committee met and trustees voted that we could have more parents involved in that. Now 3 parent reps, 1 from elementary, mid, and high school.
- Parent education portion went over school calendar and how they pick dates for holidays, pd days, etc. they're currently working on the calendar for next year.
- January meeting what we do with the Alberta School Council Engagement Allocation needs to be decided soon.
- Parent ed portion was on apprenticeship program and off campus education.

Trustee Report: Craig Whitehead

- Play and learn:
 - Rescinded policy on school nutrition. Only because it's more of a procedure, not a policy.
 - Decided to do a pilot project up to 3 schools for KinderCare program.
 - We're looking for different ways to keep kinder age kids in school all day.
 - If you go to Mhpsd.ca there's a section on Play and Learn. It has FAQ that will give you an idea of how Medicine Hat School does their program.
 - So kids would go to half day kinder, then to play and learn. Then they could take the bus home or parents could pick up after school.
 - There's no curriculum.
 - Med hat cost is \$285/month. we don't know what we would charge.
 - It'd follow the school schedule with the program not running on pd days and school holidays.
- Boundary changes 1 big concern was about the Spanish program. There's another meeting for parents of children in the Spanish program to gather more data.

· BOOST Update

- Our BOOST Teacher is Mrs. Angie Smith
- o 6 elementary schools identified for the program in our division
- Alberta Ed Funding reduced from last year to this year; no numeracy intervention planned
- UFLI and Alberta Education Phonics Program
- To start, Grades 2 & 3 students identified around 40 students; attendance can complicate the intervention success, but we try either way
- Rotations of CORE phonics survey, interventions, assessments, and more interventions;
 meant to be cyclical, track progress, very nimble and responsive to student growth
- Future: hopefully in the future, Grade 1 will be incorporated into the intervention process; Grade 1 assessments taking place this month
- Similar process will take place, likely between April and June: assessments, interventions, and final assessments for the intervention program
- Parents receive a brief letter advising them of the intervention, and offering an "opt out" process if they do not wish for their child to receive the additional support
- o Groups are fluid to best fit needs of students
- Mrs. Smith reports weekly to classroom teachers (shared document)
- o Mrs. Smith picks students up from their rooms for the intervention
