Grade level sharing: Kindergarten

Numeracy workstations – they do an activity called Wipe Out. Teachers are provided different opportunities to work with the students where they're at. Students write the number on a white board type paper then wipe it off.

Students practice counting then printing the numbers. They use tweezers to put 10 frames into a container for fine motor skills, then count the ten frames.

Read the book 10 black dots. It has pictures you can make with a certain number of dots. Had the kids come up with things they could make with any number of dots. Then they print the number of dots they used and write the letters used to spell that number.

Literacty workstations – if they're still working on letter sounds, they go on a letter hunt to find letters to spell a word. Fors students that are capable they choose images then they figure out how to spell it.

Rhyming cups. Letters on cups then you spin them to spell out rhyming words.

They have caterpillars and they're watching the lifecycle

Kindergarden night coming up for students who will be in kinder next year.

Staffing Processes – 2024/2025 School Year (Standing Item)

- The Staffing Process for teachers and support staff continues this spring.
- The positions we have advertised are: full-time Grade 2 (Probationary) as a new position, based on enrollment growth; this position addresses our Grade 1 bubble; full-time Grade 2 (Temporary) maternity leave for Mrs. Rhodes for most of next year; and, full-time Kindergarten (Temporary) maternity leave for the remainder of Mrs. Fujikawa's maternity leave (approx. Sept Dec, 2024). Hiring is not yet finished yet for the maternity leave positions, but we can announce that we hired Mr. Nolan Jacob into the full-time Grade 2 position for next school year.
- On the support staff side, we have posted 3 Team EA positions (29.5 hours/week), and 1 Kindergarten EA position (29 hours/week).
- As with all hiring and spring human resources processes, we will continue with the staffing process until we are fully staff for next school year. We work closely with human resources throughout the process!
